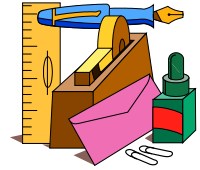

Health Screenings



A huge Thanks to Lions Club of Durand for bringing the SPOT Vision screening to our school to screen vision for children in Early Childhood, 4K, and 5K. The SPOT screening tool allows for fast and accurate vision screening that is very simple to use with these young age groups. Children who did not pass the screening will be sent letters advising them to follow up with their eye doctor. The school district appreciates all that Lions Al Gould, Terry Olson, Jim Mayo and Greg Doverspike have done to provide this service for our students.

Heights and weights are done every year and a record is available to all parents by sending a request to the school nurse, Katie Walsh-Kallstrom, email: kwashkallstrom@durand.k12.wi.us. Vision screening using the Snellen chart was done in grades 1, 3 and 5. We are in the process of rechecking students a second time and parents will be informed if children failed the second screening. Hearing is done in grades 4K, K, 1 and 2. Hearing is checked twice and second checks will be completed before the holiday break. Parents will be informed if children failed a second screening test for hearing.
