DISCOURAGING INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIORS

(Promoting Consistency)

LEVELS OF BEHAVIOR

MINOR

Teacher Managed – No Referral

These behaviors are minor rule violations that will result in an immediate verbal correction with a possible consequence.

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|-------------------------------|-------------------------------------|
| Running in the building | Disruptive transition |
| Unsafe/Rough play | Play fighting |
| Spitting | Non-directed profanity |
| Toys or electronics at school | Out of assigned area |
| Unexcused tardy | Chewing gum |
| Failure to follow rules | Put-downs |
| Classroom disruption | Inappropriate displays of affection |
| Uncooperative behavior | Off-task behavior |

Possible Consequences

Students who engage in these behaviors will be asked to identify inappropriate behavior and describe the appropriate replacement behavior. Students may receive a mild consequence delivered by the teacher or staff member designed to discourage the inappropriate behavior from occurring in the future. Consequences for behavior may include but are not limited to:

Teacher Managed – Office Referral

These behaviors are more serious in nature. They will result in an immediate correction and a logical consequence.

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Possible Consequences

Students who engage in these behaviors will be asked to identify inappropriate behavior and describe the appropriate replacement behavior. The incident will be documented using the Office Referral Form. Consequences for behavior may include but are not limited to:

MAJOR Office Managed – Referral

Serious fighting, harassment, and verbal abuse violate the dignity, well-being, and safety of another person. These behaviors will not be tolerated and will result in an Office Discipline Referral. Major behaviors may result in suspension but may also be corrected using a variety of logical consequences.

Chronic minor behavior	Intimidation/Verbal threats
Stealing	Harassment/bullying
Vandalism	Verbal abuse/directed profanity
Possession of weapons	Fighting/physical aggression
Technology violation	Disrespect/insubordination

Possible Consequences

Students who engage in a major behavior will be referred to the principal for immediate corrective action. After consulting with the parents and appropriate school personnel, the principal will issue appropriate consequences and facilitate corrective action designed to help the student improve his/her school behavior.

Verbal correction	Time Out
Loss of privileges	Apology
Detention	Suspension from school
After-School	Parent escort at school/event
Behavior contract	Restitution
